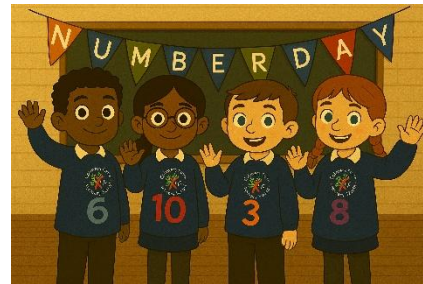


Year 4 Times Table Workshop

We will be sending an entry for each category to represent Colmers Farm school. The categories are:

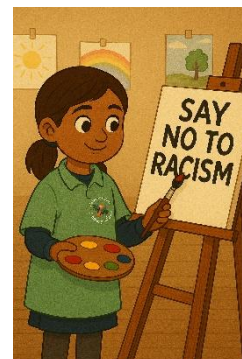
- Year 1-4 Artwork

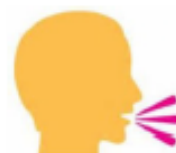

This model is made out of LEGO and is called "Everyone is awesome.". It was designed by artist Matthew Ashton, who is Vice President of Design at LEGO.

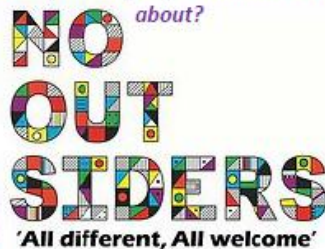
What do you think that job involves?
