Dear Parents

It's been a busy sporting week at Colmers this week with our children competing against other schools. On Wednesday, our Year 5 and 6 football team played against Green Meadow. Please remember that if you are requesting to remove your child/ren from school during term time for a holiday that the proper form will need to be completed for this. Please contact the school office if you require one of these. Please also remember that removing children during school time does have a negative impact on their learning, and that completing 'homework' during this period cannot make up for what they miss in school. At Colmers Farm, we do not authorise leave in term time, unless there are exceptional circumstances supported by evidence. We also, as a school, pass unauthorised absences (whether a request form has been completed or not) to the local authority who may issue a penalty notice.

We do have quite a few children in the mornings who sometimes arrive late for school. Being punctual is an important life skill and it ensures that your child makes a less stressful start to the school day. If your child does have issues with their lateness, please look at your morning routine and try to change it so that you can regularly arrive in school a little earlier. We also offer a breakfast club (50p per day) which would help with this issue.

We do have a lot of year groups going on trips during the final few weeks of this year. If these involve your child's class, please complete the consent forms and pay your voluntary contributions towards these as soon as possible. Thank you.

As you may have read already this week, we will be having a school non-uniform day on Friday 28th June. To take part, your children will need to bring into school at least one food item which can be donated to the foodbank. Donations of any dried or tinned food would be particularly welcome. Let us see how many food items we can collect as a school to support this foodbank which does such a wonderful job of helping so many families within our community.
