Dear Parents,

The first three weeks since our return to school have whizzed by, but in that time we have been working hard to improve our school. Many of the areas we have been working on were suggested by you, as parents, from your parental questionnaires (completed before the holidays). We have:

- purchased lots of additional playground equipment for children to use at dinnertimes, so they are more active and are less bored;
- stopped children taking their lunch boxes outside at dinnertime, which helps to prevent lunches being damaged or lunchboxes being lost;
- introduced a smart new uniform and ties for Years 5 and 6 (which look fabulous!);
- began redesigning our school curriculum to improve our children's enjoyment of it;
- created and provided all children from Years 1-6 with knowledge organiser sheets for their topics, which provided them with knowledge about their topics and additional homework opportunities. The work that has been produced for this at home is stunning;
- worked hard to find more exciting and more numerous trips and visitors to support our curriculum and to inspire our children!
- planned to introduce individual year group newsletters, the first of which you will receive next week. These will outline what your children will be learning this term and will provide you with a list of important dates for events – giving you more time to arrange to attend these;
- purchased brand new interactive whiteboards for classrooms, so that children can now see the work displayed on them;
- reintroduced a range of clubs for children for after school;
- recruited a sports coach, who helps in the teaching of PE and also organises games for the children at lunch and dinnertimes;
- moved last year's Year 4 teachers up with the same classes into Year 5 to provide some much needed consistency for this year group;
- ensured that each class has a Colmers teacher at the start of the year.

We still have lots more to do, but I'm sure that you will agree that this is an impressive start.

Please can I remind you all to put your children's names on any school uniform they may have. At the end of each break and dinnertime, we seem to have a collection of blue jumpers (in particular) which are left behind, and names in them are very helpful in retuning them to their rightful owners.


Our current whole school attendance percentage is:
