Dear Parents,

I hope that you've had a wonderful week.

As many of you are aware, this year we have introduced prefects at Colmers Farm. These were chosen from children who decided to apply for this role in Year 6. 13 children were chosen. This is a very responsible position for any child to hold. Part of their duties involves them helping our dinnertime staff in the canteen, in the playgrounds and in the corridors. I just want to say what a fantastic job these children are doing around school. Their behaviour choices have been exemplary, and they are setting a fantastic example to all of the children at our school. A huge well done to them all. If you have a child who is a prefect at our school, you should be really proud of them.

When Colmers Farm joined Excelsior Trust, many parents (and children) expressed their frustration over the disrepair of the school's trim trail. This is something that has equally frustrated me. I am very pleased though to announce some very good news about this. Myself and Mrs Pulley have managed to secure some additional funding from our Trustees to have this replaced. Our School Council have already looked at a variety of different designs for this and have chosen the design that they think will be most suitable for our school. Work should begin on this next week (weather permitting), with our new trim trail due to open in January.

It's been a real pleasure this week to see our reception children walking past our office to practise their Christmas performance in amazingly quiet and well-ordered lines. Myself and Miss Kelly have already been treated to hearing some of the songs from this performance, as these have drifted down the corridor to our office. We are both very much looking forward to seeing this performance before the holidays, as I am sure all of the parents with children in this year group are.

West Midlands Police has been made aware of a smartphone app called 'UNICO LIVE' (see below for a picture). This app is publicised as age restricted 12+ (although many children younger than this have been using this) and it is designed for young people to upload videos of themselves performing, singing and dancing etc. It has come to the Police's attention that there is inappropriate content on this platform, involving young people, which is being investigated. The content does not appear to be monitored. This has huge safeguarding implications. I realise that some parents allow their children to use social media apps (most of which are only supposed to be used by children aged 13+). If this applies to you, you must be vigilant against the huge risks these platforms can have (as I have mentioned in some previous newsletters), including potential grooming, the use of inappropriate language, cyberbullying, the loss of control of images shared, the sharing of indecent images etc. It really is important that you monitor you child whenever they are online and that your child tells you if they see anything which is inappropriate.

Keeping children hydrated in school is important, which is why we have our water fountains around school. Please can I remind parents that the best way to keep children hydrated (and by far the healthiest option) is through water. We are fortunate in Birmingham to have some of the finest tap water in the country (which comes from the Elan Valley in Wales). At Colmers we encourage all of our children to drink water in school. Please consider this when sending your child to school with their drink.
