

School Footwear

All children are required to wear plain black shoes. If boots are worn, these should also be plain black and flat soled. For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels.

Sandals and flip-flops are not permitted. **Trainers are also not permitted (unless on PE days)**, although children can change into these for break times.

PE Kits

Children should wear their PE kits in school on their PE days. This should include:

- Plain navy or black shorts or tracksuit bottoms;
- A red, blue, green or yellow t-shirt depending on the child's house (no football shirts), with a school jumper on top for colder months;
- Trainers (Velcro fastening for EYFS and KS1) or plimsolls.



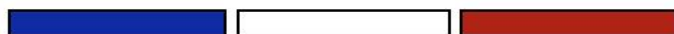
Lost Uniforms

Colmers Farm Primary School's Uniform Expectations



Introduction

It is our school policy that all pupils wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We ask pupils to wear their shirts tucked into their skirts or trousers and to take a pride in their personal appearance.

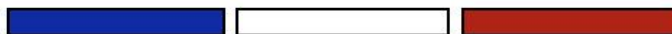
“We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables students to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents/carers”.

Items of uniform, with logos, can be bought from Kids Essentials in Northfield. Plain items of uniform may also be worn in school and these are easily available, at local shops including supermarkets.

Jewellery, Hair Ornaments, Make-up and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons, we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Children should not wear any items (including earrings) during PE days to prevent them from causing injury (including any earrings).

Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings. Hair bands, headscarves, ribbons/bows or ‘scrunchies’ should be plain and either red, navy or black. Hair bands should not have large flowers attached. Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school, unless for an out of school hours function, for example a school disco.



What can children wear?

Tops

EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 - A red polo shirt

Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 - A white shirt

Years 5 and 6 wear a tie. The school will provide the first of these in September free of charge to pupils. Replacements are available from the school office for a small charge.

A navy-blue sweatshirts or cardigan (either plain or with the school logo) should be worn in colder months.

Bottoms

Grey or black trousers, skirts or tailored shorts should be worn. Shorts and skirts must be a minimum of knee length.

Dresses

Red and white striped or checked dresses can also be worn along with grey pinafore dresses.
