## Apply online for your child's secondary school place - September 2023

Your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2023. Local authorities co-ordinate secondary transfer admissions for all maintained (non-fee paying) schools. This means parent/carers should apply to the local authority in which they live (the council to which they pay council tax).

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at <a href="https://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions">www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions</a> between 1 September and 31 October 2022. It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2022. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2022 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2023, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

We know this is an important time for you and your child. and we encourage you to find out as much as you can about local schools and how the admissions process works before you make your application, as a lack of awareness of the correct procedures may affect the outcome of your application.

Information about the application process will be available on the council's website, www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions from 1 September 2022.

The website includes information on types of schools, how to apply online, how places are offered, details of the individual schools and their admissions arrangements, and what to do if you are not offered one of your preferred schools. If you do not have a device that can access the internet, your child's primary school may be able to help you. You may also be able to access a computer via a friend or relative.

We strongly advise you visit the websites of your preferred schools for further information about the school and details of any open days or evenings. You should also carefully consider how likely you are to be offered a place at one of your preferred schools, and find out more about the order in which places are offered (oversubscription criteria) by reading the information on the schools you are interested in. Please note that before completing your online application you **must** confirm that you have read the admissions arrangements.

If you are applying for any school under the distance category, make sure you check the last distance an applicant was offered from over the past three years (where applicable). While this **is no guarantee** that your application will be successful for September 2023, it will give an indication of whether you should consider including the school as one of your preferences.

We advise you to use all six preferences to maximise your chances of getting a place at one of the schools you prefer.

You can amend your school preferences on the online admissions form as many times as you like <u>until the closing date of 31 October 2022.</u> Please remember that, if you do make amendments to your original online admissions form, you **must re-submit** your application for the latest changes to take effect by selecting **submit** again. If you do not re-submit your application after going back in to make changes, your previously submitted application will remain, and your new one will be disregarded.

Your application will be processed using the address currently held by your child's primary/junior school. Please note, if the address on your application differs from the address held on our database, you will be asked to send us proof of your address in the form of your most recent council tax bill for 2022/2023. **If you do not provide adequate proof of address by the closing date of 31 October 2022, your child's application will not be processed.** For further information, please visit the "Proof of Address" section in the School Admissions webpages (www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions).

You will receive an email confirming which school your child has been offered by the end of the day on 1 March 2023.

## <u>Deferred entry and children taught out of their normal year group - transfer to</u> secondary school in September 2023

Please note that any children attending your primary school for whom deferred entry was agreed at the point of entry in Reception Class, or who are being taught outside of their normal year group (i.e. their chronological year group is Year 5 but they are being taught in Year 4), are also required to submit an online application.

This applies even if their parent/carers do not wish for their child to transfer to Secondary School in September 2023 and wish to defer their child's transfer until September 2024. Therefore, it is important that the above letter is passed to them with this guidance. To clarify this letter should be passed to all parent/carers with a child in attendance at your school born between 01/09/2011 - 31/08/2012.

Please note that the above does not apply to children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).
