<u>Maths</u>

This term we will be exploring the composition of 10, continuing to verbally count to 20 and beyond and consolidating concepts that have been taught throughout the year.

We will also be learning about measure and time. Please help your child at home by talking about the sizes and weights of different objects and by exploring the order of events from your day to develop awareness of time. Also continue playing counting games and writing numbers.



PE Kit

PE is every <u>Monday</u> please ensure that your child comes to school, in their PE kit on this day.

Forest School

Forest School will begin on Friday 2nd May. Both classes will go every Friday. Please ensure your child comes dressed in jogging bottoms, trainers, and their school top. With the better weather, children will be less likely to need to wear their wellies, therefore trainers are a must.

Reading and Writing

Children will be continuing on their RWI journey, practising and applying all the sounds they have learnt. They will be using this knowledge to read words and phrases and build on their fluency in reading.

They will also be using their phonic knowledge to help them write simple words, phrases and sentences with capital letters and full stops.

Please help your child at home by encouraging them to practise saying and identifying sounds in words.

To support their writing please encourage them to practice letter formation and write sounds they know for words with 4 sounds e.g. clap, frog, trip.

Please continue to read with your child. Please read the Read, Write Inc book with your child everyday as this is linked to the sounds they have learnt in school. The other book has been chosen by your child as a reading for pleasure book. They can read this at any time.

A great way to help your child is to ask them questions for example:

Can you point to the title? What is this? (pointing to the title)

What do you think this story will be about? What might happen in the story?

As the weather gets warmer, it's a great time to help your child practice taking off and putting on their jumpers and cardigans. Being able to do these things independently will help them feel more confident and ready for the school day. A little practice at home will make it easier for them to manage their clothes by themselves, especially as they start taking off their jumpers when it gets warm.
