

Here are some of the activities that you might complete outside of school to contribute to the SAGE award.

Provide evidence to the class teacher and they will help your child/children to fill out the appropriate slips in school.

External Achievements	• Raising money for a charity (at least £50) • Taking part in an organised community project e.g. gardening • Doing a litter pick in your street or local area (with adult supervision) • Regularly supporting a younger sibling with their homework or listening to them read • Join the Scouts, Cubs, Brownies or Beavers • Earning a Life Saving and/or British Sign Language certificate • Spend time with an elderly relative playing board games, reading etc • Help an elderly neighbour (i.e. collect shopping for them with your parents, help with their gardening with adult supervision etc) • Present a new neighbour with a welcome gift (e.g. a plant, flowers, or a handmade card) • Make some cakes or a handmade thank you card and present them/it to a local fire or police station or a hospital/doctor surgery • Write a letter to a local councillor/M.P. about something that you would like them to change or improve

External Achievements	• Earning a new music grade certificate • Winning an award in art competitions • Performing to an audience • Going to watch a performance (pantomime, theatres, production, concert) • Visiting an art gallery or concert hall e.g. symphony hall or Birmingham's town hall • Learn to play a musical instrument outside of school • Bake or decorate a cake • Help prepare a meal (from scratch) for your family with adult supervision • Take part in a dance, ballet, or drama lessons • Bringing into school 2 quality pieces of artwork homework, which has not been set by the class teacher • Designing, creating, and sewing a puppet or knitting an item of clothing such as a scarf • Create a short animation using an animation app on a computer tablet • Record a short performance, poetry reading or reading of a chapter of a story with expression
