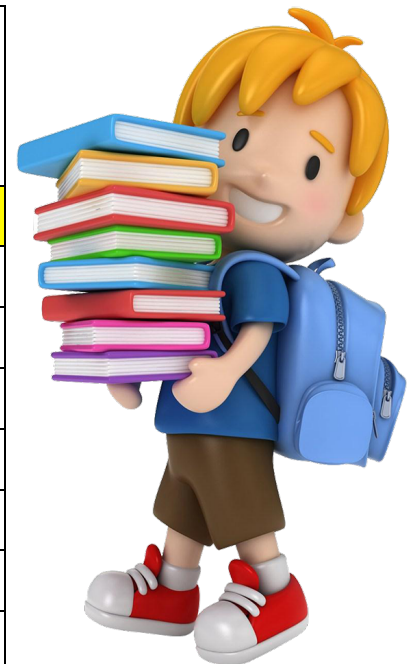

Does your child know what the CEOP button does and where to find it on our school website?
