School Meals

As a school we have absorbed the price increases of school meals for several years. Unfortunately, City Serve (our school meals provider) have announced a price increase. Our daily school meal cost will therefore need to rise from £2.25 to £3.00. We apologise for this, but as a school we have no control over this increase. Our Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children will still continue to be entitled to universal free school meals as these are Government funded. Children who are entitled to means tested free school meals throughout school will continue to be entitled to free school meals.

Please can I remind all parents that mobile phones can only be brought into school by Year 6 children and that these must be put in their named wallet in the phone box in class upon their arrival in school. This is to prevent the misuse of phones and them being a distraction to learning. Thank you for your support with this matter.

We have had great feedback from parents already using this provision with some children wanting to go everyday just to enjoy the activities Miss Storer and Miss Hughes put on.








And finally...

Help your child become a better READER

Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text.

-Who is the main character?


- -What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change?
- -What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?
- -Did the character change during the story? How?
 -How are you like the main character? How are you
 different?
- -What do you predict will happen next in the story?
- -Why do you think the author chose this title for the story?
- -Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not?
 -Can you think of a different title for the story?
- -Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?
- -Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why?
- -Did you like the end of the story? Why or why not?
- -Which parts in the story could really happen? Which parts could not really happen?

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READ, READ!

Reading is a key skill which is so important to any child's development at any age. Please try to listen to your child read at least once a day (for 10-15 mins ideally). It's also great for children to listen to you reading aloud as well.

As you know, our children in Years 1-6 have access to thousands of books online via myON. If you need help accessing this, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.



Help your child become a better READER

Questions to ask your child while reading nonfiction text.

-What is the main idea of the text?

-Can you tell me something you already know about this topic?

-What did you learn from reading the text?

-Are there any words that you do not know what they mean?

-What are some new words that you learned?

-Do you have any questions after reading this?

-Were there any features (diagrams, charts, pictures)
that were important?

-Where could you find out more information about this topic?

-What questions would you ask the author about this topic?

-What would be a good title for this text?

-Can you think of another book that you have read about this topic? How was it similar? How was it different?

-Did you like the text? Why or why not?
