
This week's congratulations assembly recipients...

Help your child become a better READER Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text.

-Who is the main character? -What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change? -What was the problem in the story and how was it

-Did the character change during the story? How?

-How are you like the main character? How are you different?

-What do you predict will happen next in the story? -Why do you think the author chose this title for the story?

-Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not? -Can you think of a different title for the story? -Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?


-Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why? -Did you like the end of the story? Why or why not? -Which parts in the story could really happen? Which parts could not really happen?

READ, READ, READ!

Reading is a key skill which is so important to any child's development at any age. Please try to listen to your child read at least once a day (for 10-15 mins ideally). It's also great for children to listen to you reading aloud as well.

As you know, our children in Years 1-6 have access to thousands of books online via myON. If you need help accessing this, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.



Help your child become a better **READER**.

Excelsion

Questions to ask your child while reading nonfiction text.

-What is the main idea of the text? -Can you tell me something you already know about this topic? -What did you learn from reading the text? -Are there any words that you do not know what

they mean? -What are some new words that you learned? -Do you have any questions after reading this? -Were there any features (diagrams, charts, pictures) that were important?

-Where could you find out more information about this topic?

-What questions would you ask the author about this topic?

-What would be a good title for this text? -Can you think of another book that you have read about this topic? How was it similar? How was it different?

-Did you like the text? Why or why not?

Questions to ask your child when listening to them reading.



Absences

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence. Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.
