

ORACY Questions to ask your child.

To further develop our pupil ORACY skills at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child their year group questions below to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning in school.

Reception: What do you see on your way to school?

Year 1: What coins could you use to make 30p? (1p, 2p, 5p, 10p)
Year 2: Name and ocean habitat and tell me what lives there.
Year 3: What does it mean to take a fraction of a group of things?

Year 4: What was the most interesting thing you learnt about at Kenilworth Castle?
Year 5: Can you explain why athletes took the knee before matches, what did this mean?
Year 6: Can you explain the different between a push and pull factor for a migrant?
