Year 4 Kenilworth Castle Visit

Year 4 had a fantastic time on their trip to Kenilworth Castle this week! The visit brought their history lessons to life as they explored the dramatic ruins, climbed the ancient towers, and wandered through the beautifully recreated Elizabethan gardens. The children learned all about the castle's rich past, from its Norman origins to its transformation during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I. They took part in interactive activities and listened to fascinating stories about knights, kings, and famous historical figures. It was a day full of curiosity, discovery, and unforgettable



moments. Well done Year 4 for representing our school so well on this visit!

4J's Visit to the Guru Nanak Gurdwara

4J on Thursday visited the Guru Nanak Gurdwara in Smethwick as part of their studies on Sikhism. Established in 1961, this Gurdwara was the first in the United Kingdom, with a capacity to accommodate over 10,000 congregants weekly. The children were welcomed by a knowledgeable guide who spoke about the Sikh faith and its practices. They explored the worship halls, observed the Guru Granth Sahib—the central religious scripture—being respectfully housed, and learned about the Five Ks, the articles of faith worn by Sikhs. The visit concluded with a communal meal in the Langar Hall, where students experienced the tradition of free, vegetarian meals served to all visitors. This enriching experience deepened their understanding of Sikhism and its values of equality and community service.

OPAL Sandpit

We were excited to open our new sand pit at Colmers Farm Primary School on Monday, which has already been a big hit with the children! Installed on the field, it has quickly become a favourite lunchtime spot where pupils can dig, build, and play together. The sand pit encourages creativity, teamwork, and imaginative play, providing a fun and relaxing break during the school day. It's wonderful to see so many happy faces enjoying this new addition to our outdoor space!



Reception: Can you remember the name of any dinosaurs?

Year 1: What are 5 groups of 5? Count in 5's.

Year 2: What do we need to include when writing instructions?

Year 3: What food should we eat to ensure that our diets are balanced?

Year 4: What was the most interesting fact you discovered at Kenilworth Castle?

Year 5: What will Earth's future look like if no changes are made towards climate

change?

Year 6: Why do you think that it is important to read the question twice during SATs?
