OPAL Digging Area

When we had the OPAL digging area installed, I did hope that our children would discover something exciting... perhaps a fossil, or the foundations of a long-lost civilisation under Rubery, or maybe some buried treasure. On Monday, one of the children (Lucas B. in class 5E) did incredibly discover one of these things... buried treasure (of a sort). He managed to find five coins, two of which were stuck together, which dated from 1910. Well done Lucas. Keep digging, everybody – let's see what else we can find. I have got my fingers tightly crossed for a fossil of new type of dinosaur, which we could call... a Colmersaurus.

Special Year 5 Science Lessons

On Wednesday, 5E went on a small trip to Colmers Secondary School. Here they got to experience some KS3 and 4 science and to experience what a secondary school is like. In physics, they explored electrical circuits, learning how components connect to create a working circuit. The chemistry activities were just as thrilling—first, they mixed different chemicals, observing fascinating reactions and changes. Then, they used flames to burn solutions and identify the solid substances within them, seeing science come to life in a colourful and dramatic way!

Alongside their experiments, the students also watched two incredible demonstrations. The first was the screaming jelly baby experiment, where they saw a tiny sweet produce a loud, fiery reaction as its sugar content was rapidly burned - an unforgettable display of energy release in chemical reactions! Later, the hydrogen balloon demonstration amazed them with an explosive burst of fire, showing the power of hydrogen as a fuel. These demonstrations, combined with their own experiments, sparked curiosity and enthusiasm, leaving everyone inspired by the wonders of science.

We would like to thank Colmers Secondary School for hosting us and also our Science lead Miss Wood for organising this visit. Hopefully this can become an annual event for our children.




Women in Maths Competition




- **Reception:** Where did Baby Bear go on his journey?


