Oracy Centre of Excellence

At Colmers Farm, we have been working hard to develop oracy at our school as we strongly believe that high levels of oracy are important for our pupils. By teaching children to become effective speakers and listeners we empower them to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

- Speaking and listening skills are critical foundations for reading and writing.
- Children with better oral language skills are more likely to achieve the highest grades in GCSE Maths and English.
- Young people with good communication skills are less likely to have mental health difficulties.

As a school we are aiming to become a Voice 21 Oracy Centre of Excellence. As part of this journey, we presented to Voice 21 representatives on Thursday. I was a very proud Headteacher as we reflected on our school oracy journey and listened to what our pupils think about oracy at our school. A huge thank you to Miss Hooper for all her hard work with preparing this presentation. Fingers crossed that we can attain this award.

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception:	Can you retell the Hugasaurus story?
Year 1:	What is an explorer?
Year 2:	What do plants need to grow?
Year 3:	What did you learn about Birmingham during our trip?
Year 4:	What can we do in our daily lives to help care for the local animals in their habitats?
Year 5:	What was it like to live in Tudor England?
Year 6:	How do you form a multi-clause sentence?

You will also have the opportunity to decorate a stone in school!








Rights Respecting Article
