

ORACY Questions to ask your child.

To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: What has happened to the eggs in our classroom?

Year 1: What was your favourite part of our trip to the Black Country Living Museum?

Year 2: What is the role of a conjunction?

Year 3: What do you predict will happen to a plant if it is placed in a dark cupboard?

Year 4: What can we use graphs for? What subjects would you use a graph in?

Year 5: What is climate change?

Year 6: How can we deconstruct a question to ensure we answer it accurately?

A train conductor in Belgium received a formal complaint last month because of the language he used to greet passengers when he said "Good morning!".








Rights Respecting Article
