#### **Class photos**



#### **Attendance**

Every day at school is important for your child, and missed days cannot be caught up. Missing days often has a detrimental impact on your child's learning and sometimes also their emotional well-being. Sometimes a child will wake up in the morning saying that they feel unwell. Whilst we do encourage children to come to school even if they 'feel a little unwell', we do not want any child who is genuinely ill to come to school. Please, however, always try to send your child to school if they are a little 'under the weather', for example, with a runny nose,



headache, cough, tummy ache. The school will always contact you if your child is too unwell to be in school.

#### **OPAL Equipment**

We are very fortunate to have a wide range of play equipment at Colmers Farm which we use to enrich our children's play and dinnertimes including our swing, slack line, climbing frame and beach area. These have been risk assessed to ensure that children use these as safely as possible during school hours. Please can you ensure that children do not use these before or after school. Doing this could potentially damage equipment (which reduces our provision of such activities) or risk the safety of your child. Thank you for your support with this.



Reception: Can you retell the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt?

Year 1: Who is Amelia Earhart?

Year 2: What does the word vertices mean?

Year 3: How many different types of magnets can you name?

Year 4: What is Geography and why is learning about it important?

Year 5: What was the English Reformation?

Year 6: Can you name as many verb tenses as you can remember?
