Studybugs

At Colmers Farm we use an online system called Study Bugs to help parents/carers to report pupil absences. This quick and easy online reporting stops parents needing to call through to the school office, which sometimes can take a while due to



busy phonelines. It also ensures that Arbor (our school's information system) accurately reflects reasons for illness. Please download the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school. Pastoral

Please remember that our Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs), Mrs Young, Mrs Smith, Mrs Taylor and Mr Williams are available to support families with any pastoral concerns they may have.

For parents new to our school, we have been signed up to Operation Encompass for several years. Operation Encompass is a national police and education early intervention safeguarding partnership which supports children and young people who experience domestic violence and abuse, and which is in place in every police force in England and Wales. This means that the police will share information with us about incidents that the police have attended which involve any of the pupils in our care, prior to the start of the next school day. This allows us to support, where necessary, these pupils when they are in school. Any information we receive is filed in line with all other confidential safeguarding and child protection information.

Breakfast and After School Wrap Around

Please note that at Colmers Farm we have a breakfast club and an after-school wrap around provision for those parents who may need to use these.

Our breakfast club runs from 7:35 until the start of the school day. This costs £2.50 per day.

Our after-school wrap around provision runs from the end of the school day until 5:30. This costs £5 per day per child.

Both provisions are available to any pupil who attends Colmers Farm, but these sessions must be booked and paid for in advance via the Arbor App. Please ensure that all bookings are made at least 24 hours prior to the provision you wish to use, where possible.

School Games Gold Award

Just before the summer holidays we were awarded the Gold School Games Mark. This award celebrates our strong commitment to high-quality physical education, school sport, and physical activity. A huge well done and thank you to Miss Jennings and Miss McCarron for their hard work here.




