He started young! Mendelssohn wrote amazing music when he was just a teenager.


He loved nature. His Hebrides Overture was inspired by a trip to the Scottish islands.



To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: What did you see, hear and smell on Bonfire Night?

Year 1: What are the seven continents and what continent do we live in?

Year 2: What is a verb? What is an adverb?

Year 3: Who lives in the Amazon rainforest?

Year 4: If you could be a Roman God or Goddess, what would you want to be the God of and

why?

Year 5: How do counting syllables help us to spell words?

Year 6: What can you build out of recycled materials?
