I hope that you've had a good week.

#### **School Attendance and Attendance Raffle**

I would like to take a moment to thank you for your continued support in ensuring your child's education remains a top priority. I also would like to remind you of the importance of regular school attendance.

All students have a minimum attendance target of +96% and we would like to congratulate all parents who do ensure their children get to school each day and on time. We now need to work together to excel even further by exceeding our target of 96%.

We think it is very important that all our pupils benefit from 190 days of learning to ensure they make progress and achieve the results they should. If a school can improve its attendance by 1%, this can result in a 5-6% improvement in attainment.

## Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

#### What this means for you:

• If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.

- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses
  in books without checking with an adult first.

- (c) My friend's phone number

This week's answer = B. You should never give out any personal information to an 'online friend'. Giving out personal information to somebody you do not know is unsafe.



To further develop ORACY skills for children here at Colmers Farm, we would encourage all parents to ask their child the below question to further develop their understanding, learning and ORACY skills around the topics they are currently learning about in school.

Reception: Can you tell me about the different rooms in your house?

Year 1: What materials are waterproof?

Year 2: How can we stay fit and healthy?

Year 3: Can you retell the story of Diwali?

Year 4: Why did Boudicca lead the rebellion against the Romans? What skills did she have to do

this?

Year 5: Describe the character you have written about this week.

Year 6: How do you add and subtract mixed numbers?
