

Reception: Can you tell me how we show others that we are listening to them?

Year 1: Why is a part / whole?

Year 2: How has transport changed?

Year 3: Why do people visit Brazil?

Year 4: What has been your favourite moment of Year 4 so far and what are you most looking

forward to this year?

Year 5: Can you tell me one fact about the author Oliver Jeffers?

Year 6: What methods would you use to solve addition and subtraction questions?

- 2. Why is it important to be kind and not judge people because of their race, religion, or nationality?
- 3. Can you think of a time when someone was treated unfairly? How did it make them feel?
