**Dear Parents/Carers** 

I cannot believe that we are already at the end of another successful year at Colmers Farm Primary School. This year we have continued to embed and build upon our successes since joining Excelsior MAT (Easter 2019). This includes, but is not limited to:

- Our curriculum being further enhanced which had led to the standards of learning and teaching continuing to rise;
- Providing more clubs and competitive sports opportunities that ever before;
- The successful development of our specialist art and design and technology studio, with lessons led by our specialist art teacher;
- Taking part in the World Reimagined Project and having our globe displayed in Birmingham Library;
- Gaining the UNICEF Rights Respecting Silver Schools Award, the Well-Being Award and the Gold Sports Mark Award;
- Achieving some of our best ever statutory test results for our school (EYFS good level of development, Year 1 phonics, Year 2 phonics, Year 2 SATs, Year 4 multiplication tables check and KS2 SATs). This has been particularly impressive considering the disruption all schools have endured over the last two years. We were also above national average in all areas for KS2 SATs (and possibly some other areas – although this is the only national average data released so far);
- The development of the CFPS Guarantee (which we will be telling you more about in September);
- Continuing to support families with Pathfinders, Malachi, Mental Health Support Team etc.

Although our journey of improvement will always continue, it has been a really successful year and I would like to thank all of the children, staff and you, as parents/carers, for making this possible.

Mrs O'Brien kindly attended on behalf of the Governors and awards were given out in each year group for being outstanding role models, looking after the well-being of others and for academic progress and/or achievement. Since May, our Year 5 and 6 art club have been taking part in the World Reimagined Project. This is a UK wide art education project featuring globally-recognised artists. Primary schools involved in the project have been exploring and celebrating 'Mother Africa'. They produced their own individual designs and then created a final design together as a team.
