





READ, READ, READ!



As you know, our children in Years 1-6 have access to thousands of books online via myON. If you need help accessing this, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.









-What is the main idea of the text?

-Can you tell me something you already know about this topic?

-What did you learn from reading the text?

-Are there any words that you do not know what they mean?

-What are some new words that you learned?

-Do you have any questions after reading this?

-Were there any features (diagrams, charts, pictures)
that were important?

-Where could you find out more information about this topic?

-What questions would you ask the author about this topic?

-What would be a good title for this text?

-Can you think of another book that you have read about this topic? How was it similar? How was it different?

-Did you like the text? Why or why not?

Help your child become a better READER

Questions to ask your child while reading fiction text.

-Who is the main character?

-What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change?

-What was the problem in the story and how was it solved?

-Did the character change during the story? How?

-How are you like the main character? How are you different?

-What do you predict will happen next in the story?

-Why do you think the author chose this title for the story?

-Do you like the title of the story? Why or why not?
-Can you think of a different title for the story?

-Which character from the story would you choose to be your friend? Why?

-Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why?

-Did you like the end of the story? Why or why not?

-Which parts in the story could really happen? Which parts could not really happen?

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Questions to ask your child when reading to them



- 1. Only adults should light and hold fireworks.
- 2. Stand well back when watching fireworks and bonfires.
- 3. Never approach a firework that has not gone off or is used.
 - 4. Enjoy sparklers safely by wearing gloves and holding them at arms length.
- 5. When a sparkler goes out put it straight into a bucket of water.

Our Attendance Reward System

Please find a helpful reminder about our attendance reward systems:

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS:



Bronze, silver and gold badges:

Every child with an attendance and punctuality of 97% or above for a whole term will earn a badge. The first term they achieve this they will earn a bronze badge, the second term will be a silver badge and if they have an attendance of 97% or above for all 3 terms they will achieve the gold badge. This means that children have 3 opportunities to achieve badges and 1 period of absence does not prevent children earning their badges throughout the rest of the school year.

Own Clothes Days:

Badges will be awarded in an assembly at the end of each term, and any child earning a badge will be invited to come to school in their own clothes on the last day of term.

• Annual Prize draw:

Every child who earns a gold badge will be entered in to a prize draw with the opportunity to win a huge prize! At other schools in our Multi Academy Trust this has been a bike or a scooter. We will be working with the School Council to come up with an exciting prize for next year!

Pupil Mental Health and Well-Being Tips



TIPS TO BUILD EMOTIONAL RESILIENCE IN KIDS

Spend quality time with kids. When they feel loved and supported, children develop emotional strength. Talk about
feelings so your
child learns to share
their worries and fears
with people they trust.

Instead of rushing to solve problems, give kids time to work things out themselves.

When children experience failure or disappointment, it's important to praise their effort and encourage them to try again.

Acknowledge your own mistakes to teach kids that mistakes are essential for learning and growth.

If your child can't find a solution to a problem, use gentle questioning to guide them towards it.

Ensure kids are eating well and getting enough sleep and exercise.
