




READ, READ, READ!

As you know, our children in Years 1-6 have access to thousands of books online via myON. If you need help accessing this, please contact your child's class teacher or the school office.














Well done 5M!

Head Girl Book Suggestion



Title: Dara Palmers Major Drama.


My Rating: 10/10

An extremely captivating story of a young girl who wishes to be a Hollywood super star, and has her dreams crushed when her drama teacher does not give her the role that she desires. Dara Palmer is from Cambodia and was adopted by a British couple, Mrs, and Mr Palmer. She has a younger Russian sister who is also adopted and an older brother.

Readers would enjoy this book because she's relatable, Dara wants to become an actress like her life depends on it and uses a lot of phrases and similes to describe the way she is feeling such as," I was so nervous...my heart knocked in my ribcage like a stick being dragged across..." As well as that, she uses weird onomatopoeia (sound words) to describe noises: huuuggghhhtttt and kzzzzcchchhhh.

I find the notes Dara and her sister had written to each other amusing, I was not expecting to see the examples illustrated in the book. Even though they are adopted, they are very much sisters. Different types of relationships are emphasised throughout the book.

Dara's life and death dictionary will challenge your pronunciation and how fluent you are in Khmer. I love this book, it's an easy read, humorous, relatable and I recommend it to others. This book's intended audience is for children. However, seeing how this is an extremely good book, I don't see why an adult couldn't read and enjoy this book.
