Dear Parents/Carers,

Please could you also ask teachers to indicate if there are any children who, for safeguarding reasons, should not have their full names on their certificate, or if there are any other restrictions.

Because of printing deadlines, I will need to receive all entries by Friday 20th November, so that we can pick a winner and have them printed in time for signing. I am planning to visit schools on Friday 11th December to present prizes.

I do hope that you are able to support this competition. Please do let me know if there is anything that I can do to help you and your school.

Please be aware that if you are going to unfortunately be late collecting your child from school, can you please ensure the office is aware of this before 2.50pm so that we can let your child know and prevent them from being distressed.

unless there are pre-authorised exceptional reasons, all children must be collected from their year group door at the correct home time. As you can imagine, Mrs Corbett and Mrs Ayres have a very busy job in the school office and when children are requested to be collected from the office it is time consuming for them and class staff and is disruptive to learning. This sometimes means children would have been quicker to have been dismissed with their class!

Children will not be dismissed early unless agreed in advance by a senior member of staff in advance.

If your child is late in the mornings, and their entrance door is closed, you must take your child to the school main office for your child to be signed in late. Remember your child should be in school ready for class at 9.00am

Please ensure your child/children has a full PE kit in school. Weather is getting colder, so please send your child with jogger bottoms and a warmer top for outside PE.
