Please be aware that if you are going to unfortunately be late collecting your child from school, can you please ensure the office is aware of this before 2.50pm so that we can let your child know and prevent them from being distressed.

unless there are pre-authorised exceptional reasons, all children must be collected from their year group door at the correct home time. As you can imagine, Mrs Corbett and Mrs Ayres have a very busy job in the school office and when children are requested to be collected from the office it is time consuming for them and class staff and disruptive to learning. This sometimes means children would have been quicker to have been dismissed with their class!
