Year 3 Team.

<u>Maths</u>

-Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100 up to 1000.

-Become more confident with the 3,4 and 8 times table.

-Multiplying 1 and 2-digit numbers.

-Dividing 1 and 2-digit numbers.

-Use multiplication and division strategies to solve problems.

-Convert and compare different units of measure.

-Be able to measure length, mass and volume. -Use vocabulary appropriate for measuring

length, mass and volume.

-Use bar models to represent problems.

<u>English</u>

-Consistently use capital letters and full stops correctly.

-Understand statements, commands, questions and exclamations.

-Use prepositions such as under, around and next.

-Use expanded noun phrases to describe.

-Spell some words correctly from the Year 3 list. -Begin to use fronted adverbials in their writing.

-Use coordination such as and, or, but.

-Produce legible joined handwriting.

-Write for a range of different purposes.

Reading

It is really important that the children are reading at home every day. We aim for at least 15 minutes every day. Children can read their assigned Accelerated Reader books, those on MyOn and those that they enjoy too. Please try to read with your child regularly to help their progress. Remember that reading will help them with their writing too!
