### SAGE Award

We would love to see all children achieve their bronze, silver and gold awards by the end of the year, so if they have something at home they've achieved, please let us know.

### Maths

#### Number and place value

Read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1 000 000 and determine the value of each digit.

Read Roman numerals to 1 000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals.

#### Addition and subtraction

Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods.

#### Multiplication and division

Multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.

Divide numbers up to four digits by a one-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders.



### English

-Consistently use joined handwriting that is neat and clear to read.

--Spell most words correctly from the Year 5/6 list.

-Begin to use fronted adverbials with a comma.

-Use standard English in my writing and speech.

-Write for a range of different purposes.

- Consistently write using the correct tenses.

- Use expanded nouns and modal verbs accurately.

- Use a thesaurus accurately to enhance writing and entice the audience.



### Reading

It is really important that children are reading at home every day. We aim for at least 15 minutes every day. Children can read their assigned Accelerated Reader books, those on MyOn and any other books that they also enjoy too. Please try to read with your child regularly to help their progress. Remember that reading will help them with their writing too!

### Homework

Homework will be sent out weekly and needs to be returned in on a Monday morning. The children will have a range of homework tasks over the year. Please make sure that homework tasks are

completed in pencil/pen and presented neatly. There will also be Mathematics, Spelling Shed and reading homework set that can all be accessed online. We will ensure that the children's logins are sent home when they are ready.
