Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back after the Easter break. We hope you have had a wonderful time with your families and that your children are well rested and ready for the last term.

This half term, we are learning about 'Amazing Animals'. We will learn about different animals from around the world and minibeasts.

After half term, our topic is 'Ticket to Ride'. We will learn about journeys and will use simple maps to draw information from and look at different types of transport, including type of transport used in other countries.

This term we will be exploring the composition of 10, continuing to verbally count to 20 and beyond and consolidating concepts that have been taught throughout the year.

We will also be learning about measure and time. Please help your child at home by talking about the sizes and weights of different objects and by exploring the order of events from your day to develop awareness of time. Also continue playing counting games and writing numbers.

Reading and Writing

Children will be continuing on their RWI journey, practising and applying all the sounds they have learnt. They will be using this knowledge to read words and phrases and build on their fluency in reading. They will also be using their phonic knowledge to help them write simple words, phrases and sentences with capital letters and full stops. Please help your child at home by encouraging them to practise saying and identifying sounds in words. To support their writing please encourage them to practice letter formation and write sounds they know

for words with 4 sounds e.g. clap, frog, trip.

Junk Modelling



Reading at home

Please continue to read with your child. Please read the Read, Write Inc book with your child everyday as this is linked to the sounds they have learnt in school. The other book has been chosen by your child as a reading for pleasure book. They can read this at any time.

A great way to help your child is to ask them questions for example: Can you point to the title? What is this? (pointing to the title) What do you think this story will be about? What might happen in the story?

<u>Caterpillars</u>

This half term we will be having caterpillars delivered to school. The children will be observing their growth into butterflies and this will help them in their learning about life-cycles.
