SAGE Award

The children have started their SAGE Award this year. We would love to see all children achieve their bronze award by the end of the year, so if they have something at home they've achieved, please let us know.

Maths

- Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100 up to 1000.
- Become more confident with the 3,4 and 8 times table.
- Multiplying 1 and 2-digit numbers.
- Dividing 1 and 2-digit numbers.
- Use multiplication and division strategies to help with fractions.
- Compare, order, add and subtract fractions.
- Use vocabulary appropriate for reading and drawing graphs.
- Use bar models to represent problems.
- Find and compare angles in shapes.
- Identify and discuss lines of shapes.
- Measure and calculate perimeter of shapes.

English

- Consistently use capital letters and full stops correctly.
- Understand statements, commands, questions and exclamations.
- Use prepositions such as under, around and next.
- Use expanded noun phrases to describe.
- Spell some words correctly from the Year 3 list.
- Begin to use fronted adverbials in their writing.
- Use coordination such as and, or, but.
- Produce legible joined handwriting.
- Write for a range of different purposes.

Reading

It is really important that the children are reading at home every day. We aim for at least 15 minutes every day. Children can read their assigned Accelerated Reader books, those on MyOn and any other books that they also enjoy too. Please try to read with your child regularly to help their progress. Remember that reading will help them with their writing too!

Homework

Homework will be sent out weekly and needs to be returned in on a Monday morning. The children will have a range of homework tasks over the half term. Please make sure that homework tasks are completed in pencil and presented neatly. There will also be Mathematics, Spelling Shed and reading homework set that can all be accessed online. We will ensure that the children's logins are sent home when they are ready.
